The Michaelmas term started on 8th September with a healthy number of 854 pupils on the roll. There are 613 pupils in the Senior School (which now starts at the age of 11), and 241 in the Upper and Lower Preparatory School.

The new Sixth Form Centre opened last week. Built on top of the Dining Hall roof, this is a tremendous asset to the 150 Sixth Formers. Thanks again to all those OWs who kindly responded to the fundraising appeal – their invitations to the Opening Ceremony next term will be sent out in January.
